The course will cover chapters 3-5,9,10.

Homework: Homework will be due when indicated on a day to day schedule handed out in class. Homework will generally be assigned each day. Assignments should be clearly labeled. Some problems from each assignment will be selected and graded. To accommodate emergencies and illness, the three lowest scores will be dropped. NO LATE HOMEWORK WILL BE ACCEPTED. If you can't get to class, drop off the assignment early or send it with a friend. The homework counts as 10% of your course grade, but if you submit fewer than 50% of the assignments you will receive no credit for any homework assignments AND your lowest exam score will be replaced with a zero.

Take the homework seriously as it is your opportunity to get a working knowledge of the concepts presented in the class. You are encouraged to work together on homework. However, if you find you are unable to work any problems without assistance you should see me right away.

There will also be in class group projects. In class projects and homework will be counted toward midterm exams.

No electronic devices are permitted on exams or during classwork (written or oral) unless specific instructions are given to the contrary.

Attendance: You are expected to attend all classes. If you miss a class contact me or a classmate for any changes in assignments, test dates, etc.

Final Exam date: The Final Exam will be 3/23 at 12.

Drop date: The last day to drop a class without record may be found in your class schedule.
